Re: Certification of Compliance under CPSIA

The Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008 (CPSIA) requires the manufacturer of a product that is subject to a consumer product safety rule or similar rule, ban, standard or regulation under any Act administered by the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) to certify, based on a test or reasonable testing program, that the product complies with applicable safety rules, bans, standards or regulations. Additionally, children's products (consumer products designed or intended primarily for children 12 years or younger) are subject to third party testing through a CPSC accredited laboratory.

We have carefully reviewed Seventh Generation products in the context of these requirements and determined that the following Seventh Generation products are children's products as defined by CPSC and subject to testing and certification of compliance under CPSIA:

- Baby Diapers
- Baby Overnight Diapers
- Training Pants
